Sir:

I am in receipt, by Department reference, of a letter dated September 29, 1890, from Franklin P. Olney, Yakama City, Washington, stating that he is a half-breed Indian; that he has settled upon and improved "quite a farm" within the Yakama reservation in that State; that he has resided thereon for the last 15 years with the consent of the Indians and by the permission of former Agents of that reservation; that he is advised from a reliable source that you have determined to remove him therefrom for the reason that he has incurred your displeasure; and, that you have already ejected from that reservation an inoffensive old white man whom he (Olney) had employed as hired help on his farm.

Mr. Olney requests that his case receive a fair and impartial consideration, before final action is taken by you in the premises.
