Or, for your own possible collection, if I may send you a copy of 1855-1955 The Yakimas which I edited and wrote several sections for at request of the Yakima Tribe, I shall be most happy to do so.

From the quick glance at your monograph I believe it has several earmarks of relationship with the Priest Rapids or Wanapum band with which I have been working for some time.

I am enclosing a couple of advance circulars of that more pretentious publication.
