RELEASE ON RECEIPT

GETTYSBURG, PA.--Historians may argue about whether Antietam ^{or} Gettysburg marked the turning point in the American Civil War but both places are important in the 20th Century war between commercialization and preservation of historical spots.

An editorial in the May issue of Civil War Times, a new magazine published in Gettysburg, Pa., makes this point in calling for Congress to authorize the enlargement of Federal Government holdings at both Antietam and Gettysburg.

In the same issue, Congressman James Quigley, who represents the Gettysburg district, strongly supports a federal appropriation to add some 600 acres to the National Military Park at Gettysburg.
