Thank you for the confirmation concerning

I will have the invitations printed up for Monday, October 8,  
12 to 2 p.m. If you wish to change the day or otherwise, just let  
me know within a few days and it can be done.

By appearing through the courtesy of J. K. Gill and Company on  
Monday, that will leave it clear for us to move onward from  
Portland at our convenience Tuesday, the 9th.

I am writing Caxtons concerning the circulars and enclosing a copy  
of that letter. You will note I am requesting that they send you  
a few wrappers, just in case you wish a window display. And along  
that line, I shall see you receive the giant size photos on loan,  
plus a tulle mat. You can determine what you wish to do when they  
show in September.

Caxtons will advertise Drummers and Dreamers in the Portland papers.  
I believe the Sunday before it goes on sale, October 6 being the  
sale date.

I will see that some 200 or more of the invitations are mailed  
out and it is possible that Mr. Wigley will be there with us if he  
is in the clear. I will send you a smaller quantity "just in case."  
And will cooperate in other manners you may suggest.

I am enclosing a clipping containing a presentation of H. Dean  
Gule's Bugles in the Valley published at The Republic Press. The  
book, in wraps because of the prohibitive hardboard cost, will  
sell for \$2.50 leaving a 40 per cent discount. It is in limited  
number and I am sure many of your library accounts would wish  
it because of the source material concerning the military therein  
presented. I have suggested that Dean write you so you can give it  
a trial. "Local" publications of that nature are, as you know, very  
high in production costs but this is a must for collectors and  
for those searching into the military history of the Northwest, (Simcoe).
