in 1874 by train from the year of 1883 they went to Oklahoma by horse drawn covered wagon looking for a home. Then in the year of 1886 they came west by oxen and horse team wintered in Heppner

Came to Washington the spring of 1887, lived in what was known as Sixprong country near Roosevelt across from Arlington. The year of 1888 came on up to a town now a ghost town then known as Cleveland Wn. Then tthe Grand father Bickle came through and settled at the base of a hill where the Sage Brush and timber meet- He located there built a store livery stable and hotel. The Bickles had 16 Chaildren, our mother was born in California on way west when she was six weeks old they started the trip on through that was the year of 1878.
