Farm at Volcano Point, Whidbey's Island Mah 25, 1859

Bought of Charles Thompson, commonly known as Dutch Charley, his claim consisting of 160 acres of land with a small house and building etc. and perhaps 30 acres of prairie and partly broken up. The fences all destroyed. The terms are cash paid down \$400 and on or before the 1st October pay \$400 more 25th paid Charles Thompson cash 400; do paid Alexander (boat charter) 10.00; Mr. Daniels for seed 5.00; October 12 sent up John Howe and canoe load of goods 5.00; 13th Howe's services supposed to commence at 1.00 per day for each working day and his board, worked 14 1/2 days 14.50; Dec. 30th Rodney's services commenced at 1.50 per day 43.50

Account of moneys paid out for Jacob Rodney. Dec. 30th Mr. Blumberg paid Indian half of canoe hire xxx 2.50; order to pay Indian at Port Discovery 2.50; order to pay Chas Thompson out of wages 15.00; paid cash, borrowed from Blumberg 10.00; Feb. 22 stopped for Frank for tobacco and board 6.50; Cash paid in full for Blumberg 7.00

1856 fort Dalles Mr. D.P. Bowles, carpenter

Sept. 27 to 13 cows and heifer, 11 yearlings and calves \$860

Note the conditions of the above sale are contained in a written agreement to this effect. Mr. Bowles, his heirs or assigns is bound to pay \$200 on the delivery of the animals; \$150 on the first day of Nov. 1856; \$250 on the first day of December 1856; \$150 on the first day of January 1857; \$150 on the first day of February 1857. He has given promissory notes for the last four payments bearing interest at one per cent per month until paid.

The conditions of the agreement are to be null and void if William B. Kelly also signs the promissory notes and makes the payments conjointly with Mr. Bowles. Signed Sept. 27 in presence of W.R. Gibson

Besides the \$850 provided for above Mr. Bowles is to pay Mr.

Madden for ranching seven of my calves up to the time I sold them, not to exceed ten dollars. I gave him an order for the calves which stated on it that he (Mr. Bowles) would pay for the ranching at the rate agreed upon by men viz 2.50 per month

the promissory notes I left with Capt. Russell who was about to march to Walla Walla where he would meet Mr Kelley and get him to sign the notes and also look after my interest in this matter.

Memorandum

Mr. Laughlin and myself bought ~~of~~ Mr. Biglow 's interest in the land warrant for his services as teamster in Mexico for \$25 and also made out Mr. Herman's papers to secure him a land warrant for his services in Mexico with the unde standing that he would eithe give us or take from us for the warrant, the sum of \$25.00

Mr. Laughlin and I are in partnership in these matters sharing equally the expenses and profits. Mr. Biglow's \$25.00 and magistrates fees \$1.00 equal \$26 was... and paid between us. I paid Mr Laughlin \$13

I am therefore entitled to half of the 160 acres of land or one half of the value of the land warrant which will be used ~~xxxxxx~~ for the services of said Biglow who serves as a teamster under the name Wolbig (his name spelled backwards) also to \$12.50 from Hermans or else half of the land, or value of the half of his land warrant when issued from the land office by paying \$12.50 to Hermann.
