In response to your letter of March 10, I enclose a copy of the brochure describing the first ALA Liberty and Justice Book Awards. No exceptions can be made to the deadline of February 15 as announced in the brochure, because the jurors must have a free period for their determination of the three award winners which will be announced at a ceremony in New York on April 25.

The rules for the 1957 awards have not been determined, but they probably will be similar to those followed in 1956. These rules would exclude a "reissue" or second printing of a book, but a second edition which incorporated substantial changes from the first probably would be eligible for consideration.
