Whitman College, Walla Walla, Wash. -- Prof. Robert L. Whitner, recent winner of the Whitman College Town-Gown award for 1964, will become dean of administration next July 1, President Louis B. Perry announced Saturday.

Whitner has been acting dean of administration since last summer, in the absence of Dean David Stevens, who is in Scotland on a year's sabbatical leave. Upon his return prior to the 1965-66 school year, Stevens will resume full-time teaching in the department of economics.

As the fourth winner of the Town-Gown award, Whitner's recognition early in December was for outstanding service to the community and surrounding area in behalf of the college.

In addition to his dean of administration duties, Whitner also holds a variety of other positions, including graduate manager of the associated students, curator of the Northwest History museum, and president of the Northwest Conference.

He is a graduate of Central Washington State College, and has advanced degrees from Washington State University and the University of Minnesota.

Stevens, a Whitman alumnus, joined the faculty in 1951. He became dean of administration in 1954, following a term as director of men's affairs.
