You no doubt are familiar with Mooney's host Dance eligion, BAE, and the section therein concerning mowhala. My main source is the nephew of mowhala. The Wanapums, moreover accept me as brother and attend their ceremonials to which even elders of adjoining tribes are not admitted.

Dr. F.w. Hodge has written the foreword. E.B. Quigley has done the four-color cover. In my estimation he is right up there with memington and Russell. The publisher is issuing lithos of the cover (without printing) at time of publication, and at your desire, I will see that you obtain a few of these.
