Let me ask: Of what nation but the U.S. could a subjegated people expect the treatment they receive.

The Indian has been released from slavery, not by ivil War which freed another race, but by death.

Did you ever hear of Francis de Bobadilla? he was guilty of two outrages. Sent olumbus home in chains in 1500, and "granted liberal donations of I dians to all who applied for them."

The first year of the 16th century saw slavery introduced into our hemis here which was to spread and gather numbers and races. Indian slavery ceased because of extinction of the race which had been most inoffensive and spitable mankind in those times knew.

Isabella, just, decreed end of servitude. ied in 1504. erdinand issued a decree, declaring after consideration of Apostolic Bull that crown of Castille claimed the right to the New YERKE World possessions and servitude of its Indians.

Columbus didn't bring gold. Successors determined. hence slavery.

At time of discovery of Hispanola , 1,000,000 Indians. Forced slavery, mining, reduced to 60,000 in 15 years.

100,000 imported from Lucavo Islands, reduced to 14,000. The African Negro was substituted. Tranted franch se for importation.

in 342 years ending in 1860, only 99 years ago, thex 15 1/2 million imported to this hemisphere, 500,000 to United States. And by then the 500,000 had multiplied to about 4 million. They were forcivly torn from country and doomed to slavery, themselves and their offspring.

Treaties with indians, to extinguish title to land, moves from east to west with the sun, with migration 180 years later 200 treaties, over 2,000 laws.

Just 104 years ago today (Trea y was June 8,1955) goods and gifts distributed, Kamiakin refused. 14 triber and bands, confederated for expediency.

But: DON'T want to have to go through with it another generation from now, fattening attorneys, guaranteed fees. Burden ofbillions upon us, billions more on unborn.

Government assisting in development ofhealth, education and development of assets.

How are we doing? You know more about health than I, how four years ago placed under dept. of health, education and welfare, gains. More services, more taking advantage of services. Yet average death is 39 compared with 61 national average. Tuberculosis, accidents etc. 3 to 9 times greater than national average. Still room for improvement.

Education: You know that too. And for this we are thankful. "e do not have situation in our akima alley schools that exist in Little Rock etc.

I think the Indians have progressed in the Yakima alley, don't you? I think culturally and in the way of h manity we have progressed in the alley.
