It is the shipping point of the Velvet Mine, located 10 miles north in the British olumbia. The name was changed from Frontier to Velvet to honor the mine (Postmaster at Velvet in names Stretter 148 (Meany)

Ventura, a village that existed in the west central part of

Okanogan county during the mining boom in the summer of 1895(Mrs.

M. Stewart of Mazama in Names MSS Tetter 314(Meany)

Vila, a railroad station in the southwestern part of Klickitat county, was named by L.W. Hill and C.M. Levey (L.C. Gilman, president of the Spokane, Portland & Seattle Railway company in names MSS Letter 590(Meany)

Vineland, a name once applied to Clarkston, sotin county.

Wirden, a town in thenorth central part of Kittitas county was named by G.D. Virden (E.K. Powers of Liberty in Names mSS Letter 295 (Meany)

Vista, a former name of Fishtrap, Lincoln county, is now applied to a station of the Northern Pacific Railway in the southeastern part of Benton conty. The name has reference to the outlook (Meany)

Vulcan Mountain, in the northwestern part of Ferry county was named by prospectors who found indications of iron there (Postmaster in Names MSS Letter 202 from Ferry)

TACHS PASH-Name for location at mouth of John Day River, Oregon, and name for the river. Named for John Day, hunkerxwikk a Virginian and hunter with the Astor Overland Party, 1811-1812. Called Lepages River, 1805 by Lewis and Clark, called Day's River by John Work, 1825
