

## the story of HAROLDS CLUB


From a meager beginning in 1935, the Smith family has guided the growth of Harolds Club into one of the largest organizations of its type in the world.




Nevada's capital, Carson City, is a popular tourist attraction. Museums, historic buildings and Indian lore are just part of its appeal. 30 miles from Reno.
