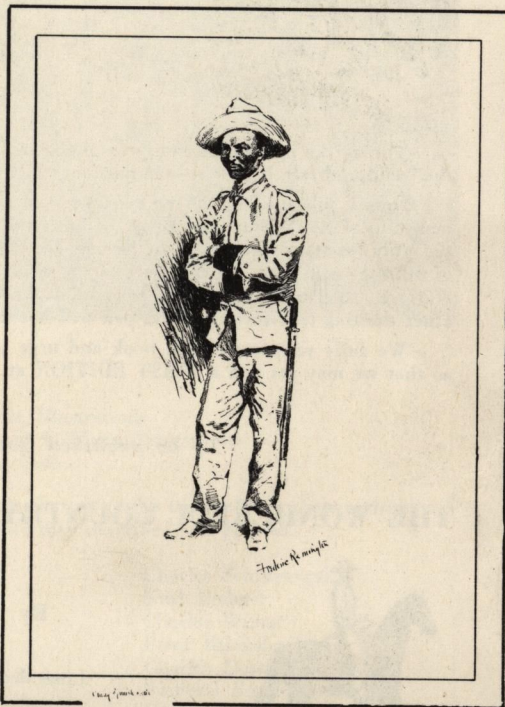

In 1898, at the outbreak of the Spanish American War, Frederic Remington with a group of other war correspondents landed in Cuba where he saw and was part of the famous battle of San Juan Hill. Here he did heroic service helping the wounded.
