Thank you for your letter of July 26th and the interesting information concerning your forthcoming publications, Eastern Oregon Trail Blazers and Oregon Indians-Then and Now. I try to keep posted on publications, acquiring them as I go along, and I will not want to miss these. But it might be well one of these days to drop me the name of the publisher and I can have my dealer here order them. If you are handling them differently, let me know.

I don't know whether or not you have bumped into a copy of the recently issued treaty centennial 64 pp illustrated booklet, about 30,000 words. The Yakima Nation, for the first time in its history authorized such a publication. They asked me to edit it and write several sections. Outside of being rushed through--some 12 nights of work being spent on it--it is a rather nice little local history item. I acquired a small stock of these and have been given them out as they last, with each advance order on Drummers and Dreamers. They sell for cost \$1 each at the book stores here, the Yakima Agency, Mills in Portland etc. I believe you will wish one of these so as convenient, and you do, let me know.
