Seeing no news from you about our future schools or Saint
Joseph's Academy, I take the liberty to send these few
hurried lines to beg you, to let me know if you intend to send
the needed Sisters this fall, as her all desire. I read in the
Catholic Sentinel that Heilcoom is left for some time, so may
be that you could have some Sisters to dispose of for this poor
place. Send whom you please, it is your business as Superior
and not mine, I only would remind you not to forget the good
Sister at Portland you know of, if possible, which I think will
be the only way to save her health from falling down entirely—
I repeat that we will have all the care of the good Sisters as far as
the welfare of this Indian Mission will allow. Keep on courage under
your Cross,

Rev. Sister Vicaire, Dear Sister Praxede

I send you these few hurried lines from our new Academy to thank you for the interest, you took from the very beginning. I formed the idea of this now verified Saint Joseph's Academy. Everything makes me confident of its success. I see the hand of Providence visibly at every step, which accures me that it will be for the greater glory of God, I ever had in view in this matter as I hope.

You know before this time the description of our trip and our coming safe on the 12th at 9 P.M. with the best weather desirable. I had the happiness to day the first Mass in the new Convent on Saint Stanislas day 13th, after which I started to my Mission, leaving with the Sisters, F. Grasse for the next day, Sunday, and the two days after. The before yesterday I came in almost unexpected to see how my good children are doing in the midst of their many privations, and I thank God seeing them so cheorful and in the best spirits. I leave them again next Monday. People seem very satisfied with them. Next Monday, 21st, they will start schooling, I hope they will be greatly patronized: pray for our success. Mr. John Kenny of Klickitat, who volunterred to take over the Sisters' baggage with his team, was prevented from going over home by the storms we had after arrival; may be that he will start some day next week, if feasible, Well, good Shster Praxede, accept my kindest respects, and give my regards to all the Sisters your companions, not excepted my good children the Novices, and I beg of all to pray for me as I do for you all, on whom I ask the peace and Blessing of God and His Blessed Mother.


