The report of findings of a Board of Survey on certain unserviceable property at your Agency, and at the school connected with it, named on the two lists you submit under date of 1st instant, are hereby approved.

You will issue the four old anvils to Indians, taking their receipts in the usual way. The organ recommended to be sold, you will store in some safe place for the present, as it would hardly be worth offering for sale by itself.

The destruction of the articles condemned as utterly worthless, must be thorough and complete, in the presence of two disinterested persons, who will give you their certificates to that effect, with their affidavits attached to accompany your returns.

All the material of which any of the articles to be destroyed are composed, such as scrap iron, brass or steel, should be preserved to use in making repairs, or for sale as junk when sufficient accumulates.
