Dear Mr. Relander:

I am sorry that your letter to this office last June was not answered. I had assumed that the attorney who was preparing the information for you had already communicated with you. However, following is the information which we secured for you.

House Bill No. 327 of the 1939 legislature was passed and became section 1, chapter 210, Laws of 1939. In the 1949 legislature Senate Bill No. 216 was introduced and after the adoption of certain amendments passed both house and senate and became chapter 112, Laws of 1947. This bill, a copy of which is attached, was, in effect, a new fisheries code and it specifically enumerated section 1, chapter 210, Laws of 1939, to be repealed.

In the 1949 legislature both Senators E. J. Flanagan and Leslie V. Morgan, and all members of the house of representatives voted for the passage of this bill. Although certain amendments and changes were made to Senate Bill No. 216, none of them related to the rights of the Sokulk Indians.

In passing I would like to mention that none of the senators or representatives from Yakima were members of any fisheries committees during this session.
