Dear Superintendent:

Appended are copies and separate stories based on your announcement of the General Council of the Yakima Nation to be held Nov. 28, 29 and 30 in the Satus Long House.

The story concerning the biennial election has been prepared for publication in The Yakima Daily Republic of Oct. 17 and the Yakima Morning Herald of Oct. 18, papers having a combined circulation approaching 40,000 with a general distribution throughout the Yakima Valley and with scattering copies sent throughout Eastern Washington, Central Washington and the Coast.

A shortened version of the story containing the pertinent information is to be transmitted over our teletype to the Associated Press Bureau at Seattle, directed to the attention of the Northwest wires of the Associated Press. These serve daily newspapers and radio stations in such cities as Seattle, Tacoma, Olympia, Spokane, Portland, Everett and Walla Walla.

Stories based on later announcements regarding the approaching election will also be published.

Since there are enrolled Yakimas and others interested in Indian affairs living within the circulation areas of the papers served by the Associated Press who might desire the story in complete form, extra copies are enclosed. The papers referred to are the Seattle Post-Intelligencer, the Tacoma News Tribune and the Spokesman Review of Spokane.

As in the past we are most happy to aid in publicizing and announcing General Council sessions and other important news.

Your cooperation in providing this news is again appreciated.
