## CHILD WELFARE STAMPS NETHERLANDS ANTILLES

1964

On October 21st, 1964, the Postal Administration of the Netherlands Antilles will issue a new set of Child Welfare Stamps. These stamps with a surcharge, the revenue of which is for the benefit of the Youth Welfare Work in the Antilles, show illustrations of indigenous flowers of those islands. The designer of the series is the Dutch artist Piet Wetselaar, who also designed the lettering and denominations of the stamps. Mr. Wetselaar is certainly familiar with the designing of postage stamps. His first design that was accepted, dates from 1953: two Red Cross stamps. After that he designed for the Netherlands Postal Service a Netherlands Olympiad stamp (1956), a Red Cross Stamp (1957) and Summer Stamps (1958 and 1960), for the Antilles a series of Red Cross Stamps (1958), for Surinam a commemorative stamp (1962) and for former Netherlands New Guinea every year a series of charity stamps during the years 1959—1962. The child Welfare Stamps 1964 will be on sale as long

as supplies last, but until January 20th, 1965, inclusive at the latest. They will be valid for the prepayment of postage until December 31st, 1965, inclusive. The price per series in Antillean currency is fl. 0,90 = Dfl. 1,80 = U.S. \$ 0,50 = £ -/3/8 exclusive of postage.

Stamps sold cannot be taken back on any account. If so desired, the stamps can be ordered with the Director of Posts, Willemstad, Curaçao (Netherlands Antilles).

Comb-perforation: 14 : 12¾  
Paper: coated, without watermark  
Gumming: Arabic gum  
Sheets of 10 × 10 = 100 stamps  
Printing technique: photogravure
