

Nov. 23rd, 1917.
The Women's Civic Improvement Club
met in the Library and was called to
order by the President, Mrs. B. C. Dunn.

The Minutes of the previous meeting
were read and it was noted that the
Secretary omitted to record the fact
that the W. C. I. C. gave the Library
Board a check for \$37.⁰⁰ out of the
proceeds of the Musical.

Bills for the \$35.⁰⁰ paid on Liberty
Bond which the Club purchased and
\$4.⁵⁰ paid to the State Federation for dues
were presented and allowed.

The President read a letter from
Bethesda Beals Buchanan in regard to
the sale of Christmas Seals. It was
decided that the Club dispose of our
entire allotment of seals, if possible.

The matter of our donations to the
Cantonment Library fund was discussed.

We have been requested to donate \$30. to this fund. Motion was made and carried that we allow this fund to remain open and accept contributions from outsiders as well as members until the required amount is procured.

Mrs. Dunn read a letter from the State Food Administration at Pullman urging the strictest possible conservation. Motion made and carried that the corresponding secretary write inviting Mrs. Gawler to give us a lecture on Food Conservation, providing there would be no more expense incurred than Mrs. Gawler's railroad fare. Date of this lecture to be announced later.

Our President, Mrs. Dunn gave a very interesting report of the District Federation meeting recently held at Kennewick.

Mrs. Dunn read a magazine article By Sarah Bernhardt entitled "Babes of Violence", depicting some of the horrors of

this terrible war, committed by the enemy in the northern part of France.
