We pay the postage and guarantee delivery where cash is sent in advance of shipment.

We'll try and work out an advertising program to cover San Francisco, Spokane, Portland and Seattle.

Let me know, Click, how many of the circulars advertising the book you want, so that we can get them to you.

I agree with you about the Centennial Booklet being a desirable premium to give to those who order copies of DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS.

Also we can make available Quigley's cover without any lettering—just the illustration. If you'll let us know how many of these you'd like to have and give us an idea as to what size they should be—in other words, what margin of white paper you'd want around the illustration—we'll be happy to have that information.

This is also true of page 120 and 183. The material on page 183 which is a newspaper quotation should not be in quotes if consistent with the policy of not quoting printed material, but on page 178 material from a government bulletin is not in quotes. In order to be consistent some policy should be decided upon. In my opinion - it would be much simpler not to have the quotations at all, and is usually a rule observed by Websters and the Manual of Style." This is in response to yours of May 31st, with reference to the DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS circulars, and is to ask that you correct one of the circulars just the way you would like to have it, and send it back to us, as we will have to bring out another printing for our own use.

With reference to the other questions, it is perfectly all right for you to accept money for copies of DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS ordered by individuals, providing they understand that the book is scheduled for publication in our Spring and Summer List of 1956.

Otherwise, I would just take the orders and tell them that we will write them a couple of weeks prior to publication for the money. Most of them will want to pay in advance, because when cash accompanies the order we pay the postage and guarantee delivery—transportation charges at our expense.

Dealers, Click, are given 40% discount on their orders regardless of the quantity ordered unless they order 100 copies. If they order 100 copies to be shipped at one time in one billing, then the billing is 50% discount.

I think that if these circulars are gotten into the hands of prospective purchasers orders will generally go to the book dealer.

Possibly a rubber stamp should be provided to stamp on the circular - something like this:

"Your book dealer will supply you, we are very sure, if you place an order with him."

You may tell prospective buyers that the publishers think DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS an outstanding piece of work - a book which will not only be a source of pleasure and information to those who read it now, but we hope will be read by the anthropologists, the sociologist, and the student of our times a hundred years from now.

Good luck to you, and let us know whenever you feel we can help you in any way.

Jobbers like Gill's get 50%, but they order 100 Caxton books, assorted, at one time. This larger discount enables Gill and other jobbers to profitably handle the library trade.

Libraries should be asked to order DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS through their regular source of supply.

We see no reason, Click, why we shouldn't give you the usual commissions that we give sale men on DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS.

These commissions are as follows:

On library orders 25%
On orders from dealers 15%
On orders from jobbers 5%
Orders from individuals carry a commission of 25%

Commissions are figured, of course, on the net billing price to the customer.

You'll find, Click, that the books of the great commercial publishing houses are priced lower than we could possibly price ours. You see, our printings are small, we have to employ many hand processes, and production costs which have always been high with us are now simply astronomical.


