In checking our collection for materials on Smohalla, we find two major references which we felt you might not have in your collection of Northwest books. One is "Feather cult of the middle Columbia", by Cora Du Bois, Banta, 1938; the other, "Prophet Dance of the Northwest and its derivatives: the source of the Ghost dance", by Leslie Spier, Banta, 1935. The latter particularly has an excellent bibliography on the subject and in checking it, we find that we have many of the sources and references in our collection.

You may not have access to the Oregon Historical quarterly. We have a complete set of the publication and there are some references to Smohalla in various issues of the quarterly.

We should be very happy to help you all that we can. If you can come to Spokane, please let us know when you will arrive and we shall have the material ready for you. We sincerely hope that our Northwest history department lives up to your expectations.


Thanks so much for the clippings and

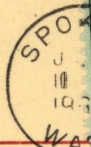
