Dear Sir:

Thank you for your letter of August 15 pertaining to the Kiwanis luncheon meeting, Wednesday, October 17, at Walla Walla.

I will be in Walla Walla that date with some of the Indian characters [Wanapums from Priest Rapids] in connection with a book tour for Drummers and Dreamers. And I shall be most happy to make a speech appearance before the club. I suppose the talk would be called "Drummers and Dreamers" or "Indians in My Wife's Hair," but it is largely historical and gives an insight into the Priest Rapids Project and the Indians who lived there.
