have been changed from October 28-31, 1954 to

NOVEMBER 18 through 21, 1954

Will you kindly make this announcement at any meetings you may be holding and notify all delegates or other persons who may be planning to attend.

This change in dates has been made to by the NCAI Executive Council to permit Indian people to vote in person in their own communities in the General Election on November 2nd, and to permit Indian people who are running for state offices to campaign right up to the time of the election. Several Indian people are running for their state legislatures or other state offices and they deserve all possible support.
