





Northern Pacific's new Pasco freight classification yard is one of the most modern in America. Electronically operated, it greatly facilitates Northern Pacific service by means of "push button" switching and makeup of freight trains. The new yard adds further to Pasco's stature as an important transportation center.

COST — Approximately \$51/2 million.

SIZE — It contains 77 miles of track in an area $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles long and 900 feet wide.

THE CLASSIFICATION YARD proper contains 47 tracks, one master retarder and five group retarders.

RECEIVING YARD tracks have a capacity of 150 and 160 cars and departure yard tracks a capacity of 135 and 160 cars.

FACILITIES also include a modern car repair shop 75 by 500 feet, a 5-story yard-retarder building, a Crest office, where automatic switches are controlled for classifying cars; service buildings and several miscellaneous buildings.

Mercury-vapor flood lights, mounted on 8 towers up to 120 feet high, permit 'round-the-clock operation.
