The recent reduction of the limits of the reserve prevented the post from being placed within its limits. Santa Barbara, Cala is now the newest Fort Having in hime last, heard reports of Indian hostilities near tohidby's Island, W.J. I Rent instructions to Least. Colo. Bourseville at Fort Plancouver, to render any afaistance in his power in that section. Thave just received, in reply, a report from Lient. Rufell, Commanding Fort Meilacoon, in which he states that the difficulties are for the present settles. The disturbance had its origin in the supposed minder of

two or three white men by the hidians. The Chief ones engaged in those outrages have been apprehended and are now in confinement in the grand-house at this post, availing trial by the civil authority of the Territory. "The most recent difficulty was occasioned "by a descent of a party of horthern Indian residing "in the Rupean Territory, afron the selllements in Belling "ham Bay. This is the most horthan proction of Washington "Tenitory being within a few mules of the 49th parallel. The settles there are more liable to the incursions of the "Tubes beyond the purisduction of the U.S. who are able "to make a descent in their causes and retreat before "any force can be trought against them. The only Rue "method of effectually checking there Indians, at the same time giving additional security to the settle. ments between this post and that point would be "in my opinion, to establish a Post of one company at Bellingham Bay, or in that vienty. Lient. Colo. Bouneville remarks, in addition to this, that acting Governor mason thinks the only "effective" method to check the incursions of the Ruferan Indians is to have on Ruget Sound a Steam Revenue "Cutter," to pursue them in their canoes. I have not wow an available company for the new post Ruggested by Lient. Pinfell, but shall take this
