

On the West side of the rocks (1)

Run about  $\frac{1}{4}$  of a mile North West of the Eschbach Park - there is a sagebrush flat -

On this flat a fort was constructed of willow baskets filled with dirt - trenches were dug around this fort which was used by Gen G B McClellan when he came to the Noches valley to quiet the Indian uprising.

For years after his departure - curio seekers could find old shoes parts of soldiers uniforms - parts of guns (rifles) brass buttons etc -

The fort was perhaps never used as a refuge for settlers - but a short distance from it were many slates driven in the ground - evidently as markers for graves of Indians -

Some of these slates are perhaps lying among the rocks at present -

A trail leading from this fort was known <sup>(2)</sup>  
as the Basket Trail by the early  
pioneers. This trail crossed the  
sagebrush flat in a south westerly direction  
near the present site where the home of  
blank E Smith now stands.

The trail wandered across the present  
Neches Heights Hill - crossing the Cowiche  
at the juncture of the North of the South Fork  
thence across the hills to the Ahlanum  
Mission - from there it crossed the  
Ahlanum range of mountains and led  
direct to Fort Linco - from Ft Linco  
the trail led to Golden dal - then down  
the Columbia to St Vancouver

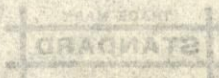
