Memorandum - To Friends and Acquaintances of Melvin L. Robertson

After more than thirty five years of distinguished service with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Superintendent Mel Robertson will retire on March 15, 1964.

Mr. Robertson began his Indian Service career in November 1928 as a scaler at Colville Indian Agency, progressing to Forest Ranger in 1930. He transferred to the Klamath Indian Agency in 1935 as Senior Forest Ranger and returned to Colville Agency in 1936 in this same capacity. In 1947, he was transferred and promoted to the position of Assistant Superintendent at Hoopa, California and later served as District Agent of the California Indian Agency. In 1950, he transferred with a promotion to Superintendent of the Northern Idaho Agency and in 1954 to Superintendent, Western Washington Agency. In 1955, he accepted a transfer to the Menominee Indian Agency, Wisconsin. He returned to the Pacific Northwest in 1961 with a promotion to Superintendent of the Yakima Indian Agency where he is currently employed.

We know that Mel would appreciate letters from his many friends and acquaintances which we would make into an album for his pleasure during his retirement years.

Those who desire to contribute to the album should prepare letters on white bond paper, 8 x 10½", 1½" margin on the left, 1" on the right, and the contents should be centered on the paper. The letters should be addressed to Mr. Melvin L.
