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WELCCME! In this building you will find something of the beginnings of Washington history, a story "just a little bit different". Washington's yesterdays hint at Washington's tomorrows. If possible, do not try to see everything in one trip! Our aim is not to make this a large museum but a most interesting one.

FIRST FLOCR - Pioneer Floor:

Ezra Meeker's Ox Team and wagon, the

most famous outfit in America. Gives
you an idea of what pioneering on the

Oregon Trail was like.

Stage Coach: We don't know too many details. Use your imagination. Pioneer School House: Model of first school in Puyallup. A man who went

to school there supplied details.
Allen Porter Wagon: Back of wagon, one

of Northwest's most courageous stories.
Naches Pass Wagon Wheel: It came from
the West's most thrilling single
incident, - letting 36 wagons down a

1000 ft. cliff in Cascades in 1853. Pioneer Newspaper Office, City Light Display, many Pioneer Relics.

SECOND FLOOR - Natural Life. Marine:
Bowles Egg Collection, one of the three
best in America, plus excellent
bird habitat displays.

Cougar-Deer Display: Folks say it's good enough for any museum. We agree.

Gun Gollection: Excellent collection.
See Chinese 3-man Gun, it's heavy.
Roman Gladiator. Armor, from old
history; not Washington, of course!

Egyptian Mummy: This one 3000 yrs.old.
Unique in many ways. Read its story.
Mcdel Boat Collection: Models of many

early Sound boats; Munch Collection.
American warships (very unusual);
many models of sailing vessels.

Alaska Collection: Now on 4th floor: Wood Carving: Don't miss Keith Britt's wood carving collection. It's tops.

THIRD FLOOR - Entrance Hall:

Washington Hall, featuring S.A.Perkins photographic murals of Washington.
McCormick Hall: Historical alcoves,—
Isaac Stevens, Lincoln, Washington,
Cushman, Liberty Bell, Pioneer
Women, Northern Pacific, Missionaries,
Buckmaster, C. P. Ferry.

General offices on this floor. Book sales at reception desk.

FOURTH FLOOR - Indian. Alaska displays:
New method of display; fine collection of Indian baskets.

Hewitt Hall: Society's Reference Library, used by those conducting research into early Northwest history.

FIFTH FLOOR - Art Gallery, Oriental:
Art gallery offers new exhibit every
month, giving special encouragement to Northwest artists. Method
of displaying pictures entirely
new; we think you'll like it.

Oriental Exhibit: Some fine artifacts; due soon for new display. Women's Section: Not large, but very interesting.

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CUR SOCIETY - Two years after Washington became a state, the Washington State Historical Society was organized. The building was erected in 1911 through donations. Ferry Museum organized in 1893 and deeded to Society in 1930.
