Dear Chapin:

Relative to the memo to curators and the October 23 date which marks the formal dedication of the first unit of Washington Rock and mineral exhibit, I'm sorry I'll have to forego the pleasure.

However I hope I may be pardoned.

The date is that chosen for the dedication by the Antanum Grange of a historical marker at the Woodcock Academy. The enclosed clipping will give you a little information.

It is my plan to attend the dedication, representing the Society. Should you have any word, I shall be most happy to convey it to the Grange.

I have not yet had a suitable briefing on the marker situation, and intend to receive such at my next trip to a board meeting.

The Grange is desirous that the action be made a matter of record so I will followthrough this letter with a letter statement concerning the dedication, and will ask that you make it a part of the Society records concerning historical markers.

Walter Cano is the Grange chairman for the dedication. Delbert Zirkle is the Grange master, and Mrs. Marion Woodcock has been most helpful and cooperative in preparations for the dedication.

Various Yakima area historical societies and organizations are to be represented at the event.
