A fence, though often neglected, is a most important part of your landscaping. It can be a handsome complement to your home and property, while serving many other necessary functions. The redwood privacy screen, pictured above, for example, keeps out dust and street noises while it allows sunlight and fresh air to pass through. The stepped redwood deck turns a sloping yard into a more useable level area well-suited for outdoor entertaining. Visual unity is given to the screens and decking by the overhead beams supported by doubled 2x6 and 2x4 posts.
