

Insofar as Drummers and Dreamers, we have an arrangement with the Claxton Press and would be getting the publication directly from them when it


It was very nice meeting you at the Spokane conference and I hope we will see you at next year's as well.

Now, with regard to the matter of the Negros in British Columbia, under separate cover I am sending to you a Bibliography of Ethnic Groups in British Columbia, on pages 46-47 of which you will find some entries relative to the Negro population.
