She states they had the same mother as she but different father and that the father and mother of the children are both dead. This application met with favorable action before the committee by unanimous vote. I recommend that the application be given favorable consideration. (Dec. 11,1911)

Your letter of May 12 to the Superintendent of this Agency relative to the estate of John So-Happy, also known as John Mason, deceased, has been referred to me for attention. The answer to your letter was delayed pending reply to inquiries made to the Colville Agency. A copy of their letter to you of May 8 is at hand.

The decedent was not enrolled or allotted with the Yakima Indians nor does it appear that he had inherited property on the Yakima Reservation. It appears that his father, George Schappy is a White Bluffs Indian and that his mother (name not of record here) was of the Ellensburg and Wenatchee Indians, and that her father, Charles Nason, deceased, had a homestead in the Ellensburg district. The

decedent's wife, Ida Joseph is Yakima Allottee No. 3025.

The records here do not show that the decedent ever applied for enrollment or allotment with the Yakima Indians. A number of Indians of the White Bluffs, Blensburg and Benatchee tribes have been so enrolled and allotted here and it is indicated that more or all of them were eligible.
