This exhibition of western paintings is the 6th one-man show by E. B. Quigley to be held in Portland. Each year this well-known Northwest artist goes out into the sage brush country to participate in ranch activities. From his actual experiences he gathers the materials for these oil studies. There are also large murals and wood carvings in public buildings and private homes done by this Oregon artist.

These studies represent impressions from trips to ranches in eastern Oregon and Washington, and from the mountains of Idaho and California.

Also shown in this exhibit are a variety of wood carvings done in pine and hardwoods, and some of his sketch books from which paintings develop.
