Today's annual meeting of the Friends of the Library comes patly, since on this day the individual who is probably the best friend the library has ever had is starting on another year of life. Ever since Mrs. Peter MacKintosh came to Yakima to take the post of city librarian she has made the library her foremost activity outside her home. During the time she was city librarian the library had one of its greatest periods of growth and she did not allow her marriage to lessen her interest in its work. She has served on its board and as unofficial advisor to the city library staff and has done much to increase the library service until now it goes far beyond what was hoped only a few years ago. She has been one of the leaders in the work for the county library bill and, as a member of the state library board, has won recognition far beyond the confines of this county.
