Dear Mr. Nelson:

The Morning Milk Company's plant at Sunnyside purchased 20,005,425 pounds of milk from the Yakima Valley dairymen from January 16 to December 31, 1942, which was our first year of operation. This was made into 218,970 cases of evaporated milk (48 tall cans per case) representing a wholesale value of \$799,240.00 (average).

As I understand your request for these figures, you do not intend to use them seperately, but merely for compiling the total dairy production of the Valley and the total aggregate value of said production. Therefore am giving you these figures in hopes you will not list or use them separately. It is necessary to submit them on this basis because of Government regulations while producing material for the Armed Forces.

For your further information, we will handle about once again as much volume of milk in 1943 as 1942, based on our present number of producers.
