I need both of you to come to Yakima at 2:30 o'clock on Monday afternoon, Nov. 29th. Dress up good like Indians, maybe bring buckskin shirts along. Wear clean clothes. Bring drum. I will bring the one at the house.

We will go to the hotel.

I am to talk there to a big group of women who are in town. I will say only good things, that will help all of us.

Maybe you will just sit there, or maybe if you care to, you will sing one song with the two of you together, to show these people how it is.

Then we will go and have a big dinner, the three of us, and I will ~~talk~~ tell you some good things I am finding out now. I will need you here for that, very badly.

Again I will need you on the third Thursday in December. We will go to Ellensburg and will speak before a big group there. Much depends on this meeting.

Those are the only two times we will need you that way this winter.

However after the Nov. 29th dinner, we will go out to see a group of boys, sons of men who work at the office with me, important men. We will show them what real Indian looks like. They meet with fathers and "play Indian." This is just a friendly gesture.

We made much good progress at our meeting yesterday. Things are going to be good for the Wanapums. Now we will get busy on the Wanawish fishery, and this we will get going at the two meetings places I want you and Johnny Buck to come with me, dressed up. The dates again: Meet me at my office, 2:30 p.m. Nov. 29. Then Dec. 16, 10 a.m., meet me at the office.
