A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Lewis and Clark Expedition bequeathed the two communities of Saint Louis, Missouri and Chinook, Washington a common heritage..."the tie that binds"....since the first city was the origin of that famous Expedition and the latter was the point at which they first sighted the Pacific Ocean and thus accomplished their mission; and

WHEREAS, the good citizens of Saint Louis, Missouri through proclamation by their Mayor Alfonso Cervantes, have extended their hand in friendship by accepting Chinook, Washington as a sister city, and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Chinook, Washington wish to reciprocate and express their appreciation of this neighborly act;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Frans Johnson, President of the Pacific County Historical Society, do hereby proclaim the week of February 13 through February 20, 1966, as

SAINT LOUIS, MISSOURI WEEK

In all of Pacific County and, indeed all of Southwest Washington, and do take this opportunity to extend a cordial invitation to all our friends of Saint Louis, Missouri to visit our part of our fair state and enjoy the bountiful land Lewis and Clark discovered so long ago.
