Dear Bob:

Enclosed are receipts from those involved with the funeral of Puck Hyah oot or Johnny uck, who died September 10 and was buried September 15 at riest apids, in the "anapum graveyard.

These expenses, # assure you, are traditional with Indians of importance as was Puck Hyah Toot. Additionally, the family paid out much of its own money for additional food expenses, and its own goods.

Enclosed you will find receipts showing payment by me to Jack's Market, Moxee, #100; Anderson's Foods, Yakima, #250, and to the family, #350, a total of #700. This balance with the check No. 2512, issued 9-6-56 by the Columbia River-Priest apids Hydro-Plectric Production System, and made out to Click Relander, 1212 N. 32nd Ave.

Additionally enclosed are receipts for funeral expenses the family paid amounting to \$250, although this includes some medicine for Puck byah Toot. As I said, this is traditional and customery as funeral expenses.

Slips from the two grocery stores are also enclosed.

And as is customary, the largest crowd attended the dance and feast after the funeral. Then I left this was running close to 400 persons. The war were parked for over a quarter of a mile down the road outside the "ohap y place. The number at the "wake" ran around 80 to 110, depending upon the time of day. The of the traditional meals was that at midnight, served with the corpse in the same room.

It is my estimation that additional expenses ran several hundred more dollars, and it is my knowledge that had the entire sum not been needed, it would not have been used. After the funeral the family waited until late in the day before taking a crowd count, and I accompanded them to the store in Yakima to complete their purchases. If the crowdhad not been there, approximately \$\fomall^2\$150 would not have been drawn.

I will be glad to explain or substantiate any items desired.

Typical to their fashoon, the family does not outwardly express its appreciation, but they did, so much, and will do so publicly upon occasion.

My own appreciation is expressed to the Grant County PUD and those involved for this humane handling of a lamentable situation. Sincerely Click Relander
