The third Pacific Northwest International Writers Conference will be held on the campus of the University of Washington, July 24-26, 1958. The theme of the Conference will be "Inspiration for Beginners; Technique for Craftsmen; and Reunion for Professionals."

We are particularly anxious to acquaint as many persons as possible of the Conference and hope that you will share this announcement with all friends and acquaintances who might be interested in attending and of becoming members of our non-profit sponsoring literary association.

While the final program will not be distributed until late in June, I am pleased to announce that Mr. J. Donald Adams, noted author and feature writer for the New York Times Book Review Section, will be the main speaker at the opening banquet on the evening of July 24. The banquet will be held in the Ballroom of the Student Union Building. Several Pacific Northwest authors who have published fine books during the past year will be on the program and Beverly Cleary will come from California to participate in the sessions on children's literature. Every effort is being made to provide a substantial workshop. I hope that you will spread the word of the Conference and encourage authors and would-be writers to attend.

The banquet will be priced at \$3.00 and the registration fee for the Conference will be \$14.00.

The success of the Pacific Northwest International Writers Conference is dependent upon increased membership. There is no initiation fee, but the dues for active members of the Association is \$2.00. The enclosed form is provided to facilitate remittances of dues for 1958. I hope that you will take out a membership or renew past membership.

The THIRD ANNUAL Pacific Northwest International Writers' Conference

JULY 24-26, 1958

The Pacific Northwest International Writers' Conference, an incorporated non-profit literary association, is once more sponsoring a Writers' Conference on the University of Washington Campus, July 24-26, 1958.

The Conference opens with a "pre-conference" dinner Thursday July 24 at 7:00 P.M. in the Ballroom of the Student Union Building.

J. Donald Adams, distinguished author and columnist with the New York Times Book Review, will be the feature speaker. The public is invited to the opening banquet, price \$3.00. All other sessions of the Conference will likewise be held in the Student Union Building, but will be open only to registrants. The registration fee will be \$12.00 for members of the Conference, and \$14.00 to non-members.

Varied program

Conference workshops begin on Friday, July 25, at 9:30 A.M. Subjects tentatively scheduled are Poetry, the Novel, Short Story, Drama, Writing for Television and Radio, Non-Fiction Books, Article Writing — and, as a special new feature, a panel program on Technical Writing.

The writers' workshops will continue on Saturday, July 26. General sessions scheduled on Friday and Saturday evenings are intended for all registrants and will feature outstanding authors, leaders in teaching of creative writing, and representatives of major magazines and book publishing houses. Leading professional authors' agents and editors have been invited to serve on the 1958 Conference faculty.

Special activities

No host luncheons in the Union cafeteria have been arranged as a popular attraction of the 1958 Writers' Conference. During lunch hours and coffee breaks, participants in the Conference will have opportunity to compare notes and "talk shop."

The Conference program will be a substantial one but will not be too crowded to preclude generous "breathing spells" for reunions and consultations.

Reservation Information

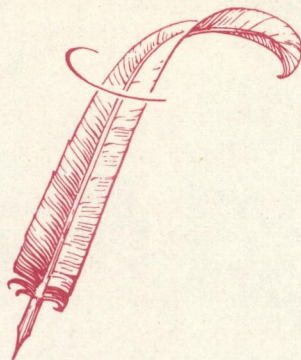
PARKING: There is a 25¢ per day fee, payable at the entrance. Space will be reserved for Conference delegates.
