If I am picked up for driving when I am drinking, they take my license and that is all the driving I do for a whole year. The maxt time they pick me may up, they just throw me in jail and I stay there, perhaps for several months. No one can tell another how to run his life. A person runs their life good or bad. A 2000 person uses the brains that the Great Brother gave him or he dosen't and that is that. What a person does wrong, no one else can undo.

I am sending a story. They are putting a bill through so they can get paid for their homes along the river. That I suppose would be one big lump sum payment, lots of money maybe at one time instead of a little every year while others spend the rest, or it goes for buying buildings and things like that. That is the same thing that can easily happen at Priest Rapids when they go ahead with the dam there, which looks like they will. But now there are so few people who are Priest Rapids people that there won't
