So I more or less grew up with the Walla Walla's and the Pendleton's, for I was born in Montana in the Bitter Root valley and have since become a professional bookseller specializing in Indian books.

You might be interested to know that I am at the present time, in possession of the Duke of Wellington's personal collection of nineteen original paintings by George Catlin. These are superb. I recently sold the Colonel Archibald Rogers collection of Catlin to the Huntington Museum in California. We buy everything we can of an antiquarian nature relative to the Indian and we also try to have all new books in stock that have anything to do with the Indian.

You may consider this an order for five copies of DRUMMERS AND DREAMERS and I want to take this opportunity of thanking you for sending me the YAKIMA'S which I am reading with a great deal of interest. I am taking it with me tomorrow on a trip to Sheridan, Wyoming where I am attending the All-American Indian festival and where Miss American Indian for the year will be chosen.

If you should ever run into any interesting Western Americana that is for sale I certainly hope that you will keep me in mind.

Again I want to tell you that I have enjoyed meeting you and I hope that this will be the beginning of a long and mutual friendship.
