Dear Dad.

Your letter came Friday also one from
Arnold and found us all pretty well.
outside of my bad spells I would do well
enough for I did a lot of work last week
I have taken the oil Arnold sends me the
recipe for and that made me have a bad
spell than yesterday I had one but it only
lasted two hours and the pain was bad
enough but still not as bad as I have had
it.. you see your Father seems to think that
it is more indigestion than anything else.
He does not believe much in my having gall
stones. So now I have to go to town to see
the Doctor. and find out what he thinks would
be best for me to do your Father is afraid it
will cost so much. now do not say anything
about it in your letter to us. for it is bad

enough to have Everett tell him of it.
Will was married Tuesday. and Everett
had to stand up with them and he did
not like it at all for you know Marnie's
Church is very much opposed to the Mason's
Everett said he would never do it again
your Aunties had invited Cora and Ed
to meet Will and Marnie for supper at their
house but Will and Marnie did not get there
untill nine a clock. They are staying in
Wills room untill they find a flat they
are all well in Chicago. we have nothing
to give Will because it is a poor season I am
so ~~wary~~ about it for Cora got fifty Dollars from
her Father when she was married that will be
a year to morrow. Everett gave them a twenty
Dollar ray but nothing to Will. he is treated
as if he did not belong to the family at all
I sold my Piano in the spring and the girl
who bought it pays on the monthly instalment
plan but she pays that at Rice Brothers store
and your Father wants me to leave that there untill
it is all paid.

he is afraid I may spend it. well I must make
the best of things. he is so good when I am
having bad spells. so we will not say much
about it. Everett picks all the Grapes. in
cases he is tough with the Champions and
the Concord are coming on. we may have a thousand
baskets. but no more. The Peaches are all gone
we have had as much fruit as any one around
here has had but that is not saying very much
may be next year will be better. I am glad
you have work Will does not always have work.
I really do not see what they got married
on. I must close now Hoping every thing may
be well with you my boy. it would be
nice if you and Arnold could be together
now good night love from all.
