Dear Mr. Belander,

We all enjoyed your talk very much. Mrs Mulhollan has since written to me and said how much they appreciated their visit and what an interesting person you must be.

Mrs. Schumann was requested to write a letter of appreciation to you. I have it down in the minutes.

If you write again to Mrs. Smallwood, give her the names and address of persons by the name of Parmelee who may be listed in the city directory. Some of them may not have telephones. I do not have a directory.

I am mailing your letter to Seattle. I know several people who may also be searching for Parmelee records. This could be brought up at the Seattle Genealogical Society meeting. I think they will have a meeting in June before the summer recess.

The society publishes a bulletin

once a month except during the summer. Queries are free to members. It costs \$3 to join. The society has a large membership throughout the United States. Many historical societies and libraries have subscribed to the bulletin.

Mrs. Smallwood may be able to contact other Parmelees through the "bulletin" and in that way she might get in touch with many persons of that name.

There are other Genealogical Societies but I do not have any addresses. I am sure Mrs. Carol Lind, Seattle Public Library, 4th and Madison could give her the address of any of them.

I'm sending your letter to Seattle, I am sure if anyone is working on the Parmelee family that they would get in touch with Mrs. Smallwood.

As soon as I can get to the museum, I'll try to find any people of that name who may be listed in the W.A.R. books. I would have to go through each index. I do not remember of any who are recorded in the four books I have compiled. They are still here and will be, while I am working on the next volume. We try to make them uniform.

I talked with Mrs. Crum and Mrs. Be Grand Young about a contribution for Fort Simcoe. We would liked to have given a registration book. I was to buy one that would suit you.

I am waiting to hear from Mrs. Mulhollan about the amount to be given. It will be very little because we are furnishing a room at Fort Columbia. Later on it may be possible to give more.

We have also given two Genealogical books to the Seattle Public Library and ten dollars for restoration and preservation of records.

Our son was graduated from the University of Washington. He is now working for his master's degree and hopes to get it by fall. He will continue his studies and try for a Doctor's degree.

I noticed your stationery - how much you have to your credit!
