The Inquiry report mentioned microfilm series available at
the University of Washington and University of Oregon
and "...if however, a cost statement of the cost of pertinent rolls of
positive microfilm of the field office records of Washington and or
Oregon Superintendency is desired, it will be furnished upon
request."

Unless such a report is readily available, I do not wish it at this
time, but will check out other material available at the Universities,
first.

This material will be made available during restoration of Fort
Simcoe, this having recently been turned over by the Department of
the Interior to the State Parks and Recreation Commission.

We are still looking for maps and plans of Fort Simcoe, which
are definitely understood to be on file, but have not yet been located.

I do not believe the National Park Service advisors will be used
in the early part of the long-range restoration, so if these show
up, I would want to place an order for photostats.
