Dear Sir:-

In reply to you phone of yesterday, would say: I may possibly go to Aberdeen, but cannot tell yet as this is our busy season here and it is rather expensive to go so far.

Sunderland and myself went to Wenatchee last winter when some of the road was very bad. Yakima has written us they want the Highway Convention next year and I think we should do what we can to help them get it as it would be easy for us to go there.

These off years little is accomplished as the Conventions resolutions preceding the time of the Legislature are the only ones that come before the Road Committee. The Last session of the Legislature I think passed all the road legislation, that will be passed and I do not anticipate any road legislation when they meet this coming winter, as they will put in the entire time scrapping over other matters that are now brewing.

I enclose some slips from our local papers. We sent Baker to Olympia and an order was made by the Highway Board directing the engineers to do their construction work where we want it and also to do it this fall and winter, if right-of way can be obtained.
