State of Washington 37th Regular Session By Senator Foster and McCutcheon

Read first time January 12, 1961 and referred to Judiciary Committee.

AN ACT Providing for the assumption of criminal and civil jurisdiction over Indians, their reservations and lands as authorized by federal law; amending section 1, chapter 240, Laws of 1957 and RCW 37.12.010; and repealing sections 2, 3, 4 and 7, chapter 240, Laws of 1957 and RCW 37.12.020, 37.12.030, 37.12.040 and 37.12.070; and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Section 1. Section 1, chapter 240, Laws of 1957 and RCW 37-.12.010 are each amended to read as follows:

The state of Washington hereby ((ebligates-and-binds-itself-to assume; -as-hereinafter-provided; )) assumes criminal and civil jurisdiction over Indians and Indian territory, reservation, country, and lands within this state in accordance with the consent of the United States given by the act of August 15, 1953 (Public Law 280, 83rd Congress, 1st Session).

Sec. 2. Sections 2, 3, 4 and 7, chapter 240, Laws of 1957 and RCW 37.12.020, 37.12.030, 37.12.040 and 37.12.070 are each repealed.

Sec. 3. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, the support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and shall take effect immediately.
