9. All exhibition stock shall be required to parade in the arena when requested by the management. All exhibition animals must be uncovered from 9:30 a. m. to 5:30 p. m.

10. Competition is defined: Animals owned by different individuals or firms. Animals owned and exhibited by members of the same family, living on the same farm, shall not be deemed as competition.
