Dear Mr. Relander:

I have checked over the files of our office with respect to an Indian by the name of "Susie" alias "Yakima Susie," and find that the Yakima Herald on December 30, 1909 carried a very informative article about her and her life.


This woman was known as Epas Susanna Eddian, Yakima allottee No. 536. Records show that she was born about 1832 and died November 3, 1911. Her father was Owhonasha and her mother's name was Waltiwit, the records do not reveal the date of their death nor the date of their birth.

It appears from the files that her allotment was sold to Mr. Reese B. Brown in March 1914. The records do not indicate to which particular band of the Yakimas this woman belonged.

Tom Yallup is over around Rock Creek or Celilo and as soon as I see him I shall convey your message to him.

I shall be very happy to be your guest as per your invitation at the Airport Chateau. A day or two in advance of such a dinner to allow me to arrange schedules, etc., will be appreciated.

Gentlemen:

We have been told by our Division office to grant the Wanapum Band of Indians a license to use certain land within the Yakima Firing Center Military Reservation, Washington, for cemetery purposes. The area is an old burial ground. We would like to have the correct name of the tribe. Also, we would like to know where to direct correspondence and who to look to for compliance with the terms of the proposed license.

The land was acquired by the Department of the Army with no rights reserved or granted to the Wanapum Indians for the continued use of this land. Since no rights are vested in the Indians, we propose granting them a license for maintenance of the burial ground.

We will appreciate any information you can give us.
