It shall be unlawful to hunt, take or pursue upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals in the State of Washington at any time except during the following open seasons, with bag limits as prescribed for each species. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That it shall be unlawful to hunt, take or pursue upland game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals on lands set aside as State Game Reserves where the hunting, taking or pursuing of such upland game birds, game animals, and/or fur-bearing animals is prohibited. PROVIDED, FURTHER, That all other game birds, game animals and/or fur-bearing animals not specifically mentioned in the following open seasons, are protected by closed seasons, and it shall be unlawful to hunt, take or possess the same at any time.

BLUE GROUSE, RUFFED GROUSE (commonly known as the Native Pheasant), FRANKLIN GROUSE:

General Open Season:

October 13 and 14 in all counties of the state EXCEPT Adams, Benton, Franklin, Grant and Whitman counties, which shall be closed to grouse hunting.

State Game Reserves Open to Grouse Hunting:

October 13 and 14 in the following reserves only:

Chelan county	Emerald Park Game Reserve
Chelan county	White River Game Reserve
Chelan county	Nason Creek Game Reserve
Chelan-Kittitas counties ..	Teaaway Game Reserve
Okanogan-Chelan counties ..	Gold Creek Game Reserve
Whatcom county	Mt. Baker Game Reserve (see exception)

Except that part of Mt. Baker Game Reserve lying within a three mile radius of the Mt. Baker lodge.

Bag Limit: Two (2) grouse per day or a total of two (2) in possession at any one time, straight or mixed bag.

CHINESE PHEASANTS:

General Open Season:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state.

Bag Limit: Three (3) cocks per day. (No open season on hens.)

Season Bag Limit: Fifteen (15) Chinese pheasants (cocks only) per season.

NOTE: (Regulation No. 750) That it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, take or pursue Chinese pheasants in the State of Washington without first having obtained, and having in his possession, a Chinese Pheasant Hunting Permit.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That Chinese Pheasant Hunting Permits shall be obtained from any authorized license dealer at no cost, and shall bear a number, which number shall be entered on the hunting license of the person making application for a Chinese Pheasant Hunting Permit.

RESOLVED FURTHER: The number of the applicant's hunting license shall be copied on the stub of the Chinese Pheasant Hunting Permit, which stub shall be retained by the license dealer.

Immediately upon bagging a Chinese pheasant during the lawful open season, the holder of a Chinese Pheasant Hunting Permit shall remove from the permit card one punch under the date corresponding to the date of kill. Every person possessing a Chinese Pheasant Hunting Permit shall, within 10 days after the close of the lawful open season for the hunting of Chinese pheasants, return such permit card to any authorized license dealer or shall place such permit card in an envelope and mail to the offices of the State Game Department, 515 Smith Tower, Seattle 4, Washington. Any person violating any of the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

HUNGARIAN PARTRIDGES: CLOSED SEASON

QUAIL:

General Open Season:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state.

Bag Limit: Ten (10) quail per day or a total of twenty (20) quail in possession at any one time.

GENERAL UPLAND GAME BIRD REGULATIONS:

Hunting Hours for Upland Game Birds: Tables on pages 10 and 11 show lawful shooting hours for upland game birds.

Badger Pocket Hunting Area: It shall be lawful to hunt Chinese pheasants (cocks only) and quail during the regular open season only, for a distance of one mile south of the High Line Irrigation Canal in Badger Pocket, said area being within the boundaries of the Squaw Creek Game Reserve in Kittitas county.

Sinlahekin Reserve Bird Hunting: It shall be lawful to hunt Chinese pheasants (cocks only), migratory waterfowl and quail, on general open season dates, within the boundaries of the Sinlahekin Game Reserve in Okanogan county.

MEANS OF TAKING:

Unplugged gun unlawful: It shall be unlawful for any person in the State of Washington to hunt, take or pursue upland game birds, migratory waterfowl and birds with a shotgun holding or having a capacity for holding more than three shells: PROVIDED, HOWEVER, That this shall not prohibit the possession of such automatic loading or hand-operated repeating shotgun providing the magazine thereof shall have been cut off or plugged with a one-piece metal or wooden plug or filler incapable of removal through the loading end thereof and which plug reduces the capacity of said magazine to two shells.

Rifles and pistols unlawful: It shall be unlawful for any person in the State of Washington to hunt, shoot at, or kill, Chinese pheasants, Hungarian partridges, quail, migratory waterfowl or migratory game birds with a rifle or pistol within the State of Washington.

Unlawful to disguise sex or kind: It shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession while in the field or forests, or while upon any highway, train, car, boat or any other conveyance during any hunting trip, any game bird, the carcass of which has been plucked or mutilated in any manner so as to disguise the species, kind or sex thereof.

DEER: (See gun regulation on pages 13 and 14.)

General Open Season:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state EXCEPT Adams, Benton, Franklin, Grant and Whitman counties, and that part of Mason and Kitsap counties lying within the following described boundary, which shall be closed to deer hunting:

Beginning at the point where the Bear Creek, or Mission Lake Road joins the Old Navy Yard Highway near the mouth of Bear Creek; thence northwesterly along said Mission Lake Road to the point where it is joined by the Gold Creek Truck Trail or C.C.C. Road near the Mason-Kitsap county line; thence northerly along said C.C.C. Road to its junction with the Gold Creek Road; thence easterly on the Gold Creek Road to its junction with the Union River Road and Bremerton Game Reserve Boundary; thence southerly down the Union River Road, or Game Reserve boundary, to its junction with the Old Navy Yard Highway; thence southwesterly along the Old Navy Yard Highway to its junction with the Bear Creek Road and point of beginning.

Extended Season:

October 31 to November 10, both dates inclusive, in Spokane, Stevens and Pend Oreille counties.

State Game Reserves Open to Deer Hunting:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in the following reserves only:

Chelan county Emerald Park Game Reserve
Chelan county White River Game Reserve
Chelan county Nason Creek Game Reserve
Chelan-Kittitas counties Teanaway Game Reserve
Okanogan-Chelan counties Gold Creek Game Reserve
Whatcom county Mt. Baker Game Reserve
(see exception)

Except that part of Mt. Baker Game Reserve lying within a three mile radius of the Mt. Baker lodge.

Bag Limit: One (1) buck deer having at least one branched antler. The head of said deer shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation.

SPECIAL DEER SEASONS: (Note: All special seasons are established to relieve game damage to agricultural crops.)

Whidby Island Special Deer Season: Island county.

Open season: October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to remove any deer from the described special open area without first having such deer tagged by a game protector or authorized representative of the Department of Game.

Open area: Whidby Island in Island county.

DOUGLAS COUNTY SPECIAL DEER SEASON: Portion of Douglas county.

Open season: November 10 and 11.

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to possess any deer killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All deer transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all deer retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 24 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: The lawful hunting area shall include all lands on the east side of the Columbia River that are within one and one-half miles of the east bank of the Columbia River between the East Wenatchee Bridge and the Beebe Bridge.

PEND OREILLE COUNTY SPECIAL DEER SEASON: Portion of Pend Oreille county.

Open season: November 14, 15, 16 and 17.

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to possess any deer killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All deer transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all deer retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 24 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: The lawful hunting area shall include all lands on the east side of the Pend Oreille River that are within three (3) miles of the east bank of the Pend Oreille River between the Ione Bridge and the Idaho line; those lands on the west side of the Pend Oreille River that are within three miles of the west bank of the Pend Oreille River between the Ione Bridge and the town of Usk; those lands in the southern part of Pend Oreille county lying south of the Pend Oreille River from the Idaho line to the town of Usk, south of the eighth Standard Parallel from Usk to the Stevens county line

EXCEPT all lands south of this line that are within the boundary of the National Forest are closed to deer hunting during this season.

BAINBRIDGE ISLAND SPECIAL DEER SEASON: Kitsap County.

Special restrictions: Use of any type of firearms other than shotguns firing slugs or buckshot are prohibited. **Open season:** October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to remove any deer from the described special open area without first having such deer tagged by a game protector or authorized representative of the Department of Game.

Open area: Bainbridge Island in Kitsap county.

BOW AND ARROW SEASONS: (Areas open only to bow and arrow hunting.)

MAD RIVER BOW AND ARROW AREA: Chelan county.

Open season: October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to hunt game animals and game birds for which there is an open season as provided by these regulations, in any other manner than with bow and arrow within the area of Chelan county described below during the period October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) buck deer having at least one branched antler. The head of said deer shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. Other game animals and game birds; same as provided in these regulations.

Open area: The area wherein lawful hunting may be done only with a bow and arrow during the period shown shall include all lands within the following described boundaries: Beginning at a point near Maverick Peak where the Mad River Trail joins the Entiat Summit Road in Sec. 16, Twp. 27 N., R. 18 E. W. M.; thence in a southeasterly direction down said Mad River Trail to the point where it is joined by the Cougar Creek Trail in Sec. 23, Twp. 27 N., R. 18 E. W. M.; thence northerly up said Cougar Creek Trail to a point one-half mile more or less due east of Cougar Mountain; thence due west to Cougar Mountain; thence in a northerly direction on a straight line drawn between Cougar Mountain and Klone Peak to a point near Devil Lake, where said line is intersected by the Klone Peak Trail; thence in a northerly direction down the Klone Peak Trail to the point where it joins the Entiat River Road; thence up said Entiat River Road one mile more or less to the point where said road is joined by the Three Creek Trail in Sec. 16, Twp. 29 N., R. 18 E. W. M.; thence southwesterly up said Three Creek Trail to the Entiat Summit (Chiwawa River-Entiat River Divide); thence southerly down the Entiat Summit to the point where it is intersected by the Entiat Summit Road near Maverick Peak and continuing a short distance along said Summit Road to its junction with the Mad River Trail and point of beginning.

PIERCE COUNTY GAME RESERVE BOW AND ARROW AREA: Pierce county.

Open season: December 1 to 15, both dates inclusive. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to hunt, take or pursue deer within the boundary of the Pierce County Game Reserve in any other manner than with bow and arrow during the special season, December 1 to 15, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) deer of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to possess any deer killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person au-

thorized by the Department of Game. All deer transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all deer retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 24 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: Pierce County Game Reserve in Pierce County, which is commonly known as the Tacoma Game Reserve.

NOTE: Any season or area open to hunting with firearms is also open to bow and arrow hunting and the same limits and license requirements apply to both.

BEAR: Western Washington (all counties lying west of the summit of the Cascade Mountains).

Open season:

Year around or the entire year EXCEPT, That it shall be unlawful to hunt or kill bear during the elk season in all counties open to elk hunting.

State Game Reserve Open to Bear Hunting:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in the Mt. Baker Game Reserve, Whatcom county, EXCEPT that part of the Mt. Baker Game Reserve lying within a three-mile radius of the Mt. Baker lodge.

Bag Limit: No limit.

BEAR: Eastern Washington (all counties lying east of the summit of the Cascade Mountains).

Open season:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in all counties having an open deer season.

State Game Reserves Open to Bear Hunting:

October 13 to 30, both dates inclusive, in the following reserves only:

Bag Limit: One (1) bear.

ELK: (See gun regulation on pages 13 and 14.)

General Open Season:

November 3 to 11, both dates inclusive, in the following counties only:

State Game Reserves Open to Elk Hunting:

November 3 to 11, both dates inclusive:

Columbia-Garfield counties...Tucannon Game Reserve
Yakima countyRattlesnake Game Reserve

Bag Limit: One (1) elk with visible horns, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. PROVIDED, That all elk killed in Columbia, Garfield, Asotin and Walla Walla counties must be checked at a Game Department checking station not later than 48 hours after close of the season.

SPECIAL ELK SEASONS: (Open to elk of either sex.)

Walla Walla and Columbia counties special elk seasons:

Portions of Walla Walla and Columbia counties.

Open Seasons: October 1 and 2, both dates inclusive, AND November 3 to 11, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. PROVIDED, That it shall be unlawful to possess any elk killed in these special open areas which have not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All elk transported out of the areas shall be tagged before leaving such areas and all elk retained within such open areas shall be tagged not later than 48 hours after the close of this special season.

Open Area No. 1: The lawful hunting area shall include all lands lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the point where Mill Creek Road joins the Walla Walla-Dayton Highway at Walla Walla; thence northeasterly along the Walla Walla-Dayton Highway to the point where it is joined by the Payne Hollow Road, approximately two miles southwest of Dayton; thence southerly up the Payne Hollow Road to its junction with the Lewis Peak Road; thence southerly along the Lewis Peak Road generally following the divide between the Touchet and Coppel watersheds to the end of the road near Lewis Peak; thence due south to the north boundary of the Mill Creek Watershed; thence southwesterly along the boundary of the Mill Creek Watershed to the Oregon line; thence west along the Oregon-Washington line to the point where said line crosses the Mill Creek Road; thence northwesterly along the Mill Creek Road to the point where it joins the Dayton-Walla Walla Highway and point of beginning.

Open Area No. 2: The lawful hunting area shall include all lands lying within the following described boundary: Beginning at the point where the Patit Creek Road leaves the town of Dayton; thence easterly up the Patit Creek Road to its junction with the Lewis Gulch Road; thence easterly up the Lewis Gulch Road to its junction with the Maloney Mountain Road; thence easterly along the Maloney Mountain Road to the Hardsock Grade Road; thence northerly down the Hardsock Grade to the Tucannon River Road; thence southerly up the Tucannon River Road to the Patrick Trail Road; thence westerly up the Patrick Trail Road to the Skyline Road; thence southerly up the Skyline Road to the point where it is joined by the Lewis Creek Trail; thence westerly down the Lewis Creek Trail to the point where it joins the road down the North Fork of the Touchet River; thence northwesterly down the Touchet River Road to the town of Dayton and point of beginning.

NOTE: This season has been established as a corrective measure only to remove a limited number of elk causing damage to agricultural crops.

WILLAPA RIVER AREA SPECIAL ELK SEASON: Portion of Pacific county.

Open season: November 1 and 2.

Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. PROVIDED, That it shall be unlawful to possess any elk killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All elk transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all elk retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 48 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: The lawful hunting area includes that part of the watershed of the Willapa River lying south of the Main Willapa River and east of the South Fork of the Willapa River.

ASOTIN AND GARFIELD COUNTIES SPECIAL ELK SEASON: Parts of Asotin and Garfield counties.

Open season: November 3 to 11, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. PROVIDED, That it shall be unlawful to possess any elk killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All elk transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all elk retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 48 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: The lawful hunting area shall include the following described lands: All lands of Asotin county lying outside the National Forest boundary and the Fordyce and Horak deeded lands lying within the Forest boundary. That part of Garfield county lying outside the National Forest boundary between the Garfield-Asotin county line and the Mountain Highway and bounded on the north by the Pomeroy-Clarkston Highway; all lands lying outside the National Forest boundary in the Grouse Flat area of Garfield county and the following sections and parts thereof within the National Forest boundary: W. $\frac{1}{2}$ of Sec. 1, Secs. 2, 3, 10, 11, 12 and that part of Secs. 4 and 9 lying east of the Mountain Highway, all being in Twp. 9 N., R. 42, E. W. M.

CHELAN COUNTY SPECIAL ELK SEASON: Chelan county.

Open Season: November 17 to 30, both dates inclusive.
Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to possess any elk killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All elk transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all elk retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 48 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: All of Chelan county.

QUINAUT RIVER AREA SPECIAL ELK SEASON: Portions of Grays Harbor and Jefferson counties.

Open Season: November 12, 1946, to February 28, 1947, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to possess any elk killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All elk transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all elk retained within such open area shall be tagged not later than 48 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: The lawful hunting area includes all lands on the south side of the Quinault River and Quinault Lake lying within the watershed of the Quinault River and Quinault Lake, between Willaby Creek and the National Park boundary; and, in addition, all privately owned lands within the boundary of the Olympic National Park in the watershed of the Quinault River.

ELWHA RIVER AREA SPECIAL ELK SEASON: Clallam county.

Open Season: November 12, 1946, to February 28, 1947, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: One (1) elk of either sex, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to possess any elk killed in this special open area which has not been tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game. All elk transported out of the area shall be tagged before leaving such area and all elk retained within such area shall be tagged not later than 48 hours after the close of this special season.

Open area: The lawful hunting area includes all lands in the watershed of the Elwha River between the Olympic Loop Highway and the National Park boundary; and, all privately owned lands within the National Park boundary in the watershed of the Elwha River.

HUNTING HOURS FOR DEER, ELK AND BEAR: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

LEGAL LIMIT OF GAME: One deer and one elk are the yearly limits per hunter. A hunter taking a deer or elk in a special season occurring before the regular seasons is automatically disqualified from hunting in the regular deer or elk season of that year.

RABBITS: (Cottontail and Snowshoe.)

General Open Season:

October 13, 1946, to February 28, 1947, both dates inclusive, in all counties of the state, **EXCEPT,** That it shall be lawful to hunt, take or pursue rabbits during the entire year in Clark county and on Whidby Island in Island county, **EXCEPT** closed season in Clark county from September 1 to October 12, both dates inclusive.

Bag Limit: Five (5) rabbits per day, straight or mixed bag, or in possession at any one time. **EXCEPT,** no bag limit in Clark county and on Whidby Island in Island county.

Hunting Hours for Rabbits: One-half hour before sunrise to sunset.

SQUIRRELS: (Gray Squirrel and Black Squirrel) **CLOSED SEASON**

FUR-BEARING ANIMALS: (Except BEAVER and FISHER, closed season.)

General Open Season: (Except Marten.)

December 1, 1946, to January 15, 1947, both dates inclusive.

Provided: It shall be unlawful to trap muskrat in muskrat mounds or houses.

Provided: It shall be lawful to trap fur-bearing animals within the boundaries of the Lake Washington, Pierce county, Little Spokane and Burnt Bridge Creek Game reserves from December 1, 1946, to January 15, 1947, both dates inclusive.

Provided: It shall be lawful for any person holding a trapper's license to hunt raccoon with dogs during the open trapping season.

Provided: It shall be unlawful for any person to shoot fur-bearing animals except raccoon with any firearms whatsoever; and it shall be unlawful to shoot or pursue raccoon with a firearm between sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.

Extended Raccoon Season:

January 16 to February 28, 1947, both dates inclusive in San Juan county.

Bag Limit: No limit.

SPECIAL MARTEN SEASON:

December 1 to 31, both dates inclusive, PROVIDED, That the taking of marten during this special season shall be open to all licensed trappers who shall strictly abide by the following requirements:

(1) It shall be unlawful for any trapper to use more than 36 traps.

(2) Within thirteen (13) days after the close of the lawful open season on marten each trapper shall present his skins for tagging and inspection to the local game protector in the area in which he traps; **AND,** at that time the said game protector shall tag each skin. **PROVIDED,** That it shall be unlawful to sell any marten skins taken in the State of Washington not so tagged, and, that on and after January 14, 1947, it shall be unlawful for any person to possess any marten skins taken in the State of Washington not so tagged.

Bag Limit: No Limit.

1946 CONTROLLED HUNTING AREAS:

The following special hunting season and regulations thereto were fixed in compliance with Chapter 126, Session Laws of 1941:

Controlled hunting seasons are adopted as corrective measures only. They are established only for the purpose of handling private property and range damage complaints. Controlled hunting areas are not necessarily areas where unusually good hunting conditions will be found.

NOTICE

Only persons who are previous holders of a 1946 supplemental elk license and who have previously hunted unsuccessfully during the 1946 elk seasons are eligible to apply for permits to hunt during the 1946 special controlled elk seasons.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

Persons desiring to participate in this drawing must personally make written application to the office of the Department of Game, 515 Smith Tower, Seattle 4, Washington.

Important: Applications must be made on a one cent (1¢) postcard which may be secured at any United States post-office or postal station.

Cards must contain the following information:

- (1) Name and address of applicant.
- (2) Number and name of area which applicant desires to hunt.
- (3) Applicant must give the number of his 1946 hunting license and the number of his 1946 supplemental elk license.
- (4) Applicant must certify that he has previously hunted during the 1946 elk hunting seasons and has not killed an elk.
- (5) Cards shall be mailed to the Department of Game, 515 Smith Tower, Seattle 4, Washington.

NOTE: Two persons may apply together. If two persons desire to hunt together, they may make application on a single postcard. If the card is drawn, both applicants will receive special hunting permits. No more than two applications will be accepted on any one card.

WARNING: Any person entering his name on more than one application for the controlled hunt will be eliminated entirely from the drawing. Applications received by the Department of Game which do not contain the above information or do not comply with the above requirements and those received after the closing date and hour listed for the area will not be eligible to be drawn.

Applicants are not required to be present at the drawing. The drawing will be supervised by two resident citizens of the county in which the special season is held.

Persons whose names are drawn will be notified by mail from the Department of Game.

Permits are not transferable.

All hunters are required to check into the controlled hunting area at Department of Game checking station.

All elk killed must be tagged by a game protector or person authorized by the Department of Game before being transported outside of the area.

ELK AREA NO. 1. WENAS-TANEUM AREA, KITTITAS AND YAKIMA COUNTIES

Season: November 28, 29, 30.

450 Special Permits to be issued.

Bag Limit: One (1) antlerless elk, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation.

Applications must be received by the Department of Game, 515 Smith Tower, Seattle 4, Washington, not later than November 18, 1946, at 12:00 noon. Drawing will be held at 1:30 p. m. November 21, 1946, at the City Hall in the town of Naches, Washington.

Open Hunting Area: The lawful hunting area shall include all lands within the following described boundary: Beginning at the point where Little Creek is crossed by U. S. Highway 410, approximately seven miles west of Cle Elum; thence southeasterly along

U. S. Highway 410 to the point where it joins the Naches Pass Highway in the City of Yakima; thence northwesterly along the Naches Pass Highway to the point where it is joined by the Bald Mountain Road; thence easterly up the Bald Mountain Road to Rocky Flat and junction with the Rocky Flat-Wenas Road; thence easterly down the Rocky Flat-Wenas Road to the point where it is crossed by the National Forest boundary on the east line of Sec. 13, T. 16 N., R. 15 E. W. M.; thence northerly along the National Forest boundary to the point where it is crossed by the Tamarack Springs Road near Tamarack Springs; thence northerly down the Tamarack Springs Road to its junction with the Taneum Creek Road; thence westerly along the Taneum Creek Road, approximately one mile to the point where it is joined by the Cle Elum Ridge Road; thence westerly up the Cle Elum Ridge Road to the point where it passes out of the National Forest on the north line of Sec. 18, T. 19 N., R. 15 E. W. M.; thence northeasterly along the National Forest boundary to the point where it is crossed by Little Creek; thence northerly down Little Creek to the point where it is crossed by U. S. Highway 410 and point of beginning.

ELK AREA NO. 2. COWICHE AREA, YAKIMA COUNTY

Season: November 28, 29, 30.

200 Special Permits to be issued.

Bag Limit: One (1) antlerless elk, the head of which shall remain with the carcass thereof while in transportation.

Applications must be received by the Department of Game, 515 Smith Tower, Seattle 4, Washington, not later than November 18, 1946, at 12:00 noon. Drawing will be held at 2:30 p. m. November 21, 1946, at the City Hall in the town of Naches, Washington.

Open Hunting Area: The lawful hunting area shall include all lands within the following described boundary: Beginning at the point where the Oak Springs road crosses the Tieton Canal, approximately three miles west of Growmore; thence northerly along the Tieton Canal by the town of Tieton and continuing westerly along the canal to its source on the Tieton River; thence up the Tieton River and Rimrock Lake to the mouth of the South Fork of the Tieton River; thence up the South Fork of the Tieton River to the point where it is crossed by the Blue Slide Trail; thence southeasterly up the Blue Slide Trail to its junction with the Darland Mountain Road near Blue Lake; thence southerly along the Darland Mountain Road to Darland Mountain; thence due south from Darland Mountain to the north boundary of the Yakima Indian Reservation; thence easterly along the north boundary of the Indian Reservation to where it is crossed by the road up the South Fork of Ahtanum Creek; thence easterly down the Ahtanum Creek Road through Tampico to its junction with the Oak Springs Road, approximately two miles east of Tampico; thence northerly up the Oak Springs Road to the point where it crosses the Tieton Canal and point of beginning.

REGULATIONS AND LAWS PERTAINING TO HUNTING:

It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, pursue, shoot at, take or kill any deer, elk or bear in the State of Washington while using any shell or cartridge containing, using, shooting or firing any full metal cased bullet. (Regulation No. 649, passed at regular meeting of State Game Commission July, 1944.)

It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, pursue, shoot at, take or kill any deer, elk or bear in the State of Washington with or by the use of any fully automatic rifle or machine gun, namely any rifle which will or is capable of firing more than one shell by a single depression or pull of the trigger. (Regulation No. 717, passed at regular meeting of State Game Commission October 1, 1945.)

Tagging Requirements: All fur-bearing animals, game animals, upland game birds and migratory waterfowl, and all parts thereof, in possession of any person, firm or corporation, other than the person who shot or took the same shall have attached thereto a written statement made and signed by the person who shot or took the same, setting out his license number, the date when shot or taken, and the name of the county in which the same was shot or taken.

Any such person who fails to so make and sign such statement shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Any other person, firm or corporation in possession of such fur-bearing animal or game animal or bird, or waterfowl, or part thereof, without having such written statement so attached, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. (Regulation passed at regular meeting of State Game Commission October 10, 1933.)

Time Limit for Possessing Game Animals and Upland Game Birds: It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession any upland game bird or part thereof after March 1st following acquisition thereof, and it shall be unlawful for any person to have in his possession any big game animal or part thereof after July 1st following acquisition thereof. **PROVIDED,** That anyone in lawful possession of any upland game bird or part thereof, or any big game animal, or part thereof, may have the same in possession after said dates upon procuring a permit from the Director of Game or his duly authorized agents, authorizing such permittee to have the same in his possession. However, nothing herein shall prohibit the lawful possession of mounted trophies and pelts in the manner provided by law.

Use of Firearms by Minor: No minor under the age of fourteen years shall handle or have in his possession or under his control, except while accompanied by or under the immediate charge of his parent or guardian, any firearm of any kind for hunting or target practice, or for other purposes. Every person violating any of the foregoing provisions or aiding or knowingly permitting any such minor to violate the same shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. (Laws 1909, page 984, P. 308.)

1. No predatory animal permit is required to collect bounty.
2. Any holder of a resident hunting and fishing license may collect bounty. Such license must have been issued before predator was taken.
3. Any person under 16 years of age, who has been a resident of the state for six (6) months will not be required to have a license in order to collect bounty.
4. Game protectors are authorized to check predators and certify bounty claims.
5. Each bounty applicant must furnish the game protector with the date, also the name of the county in which each predator was taken.
6. The hind leg bones must be left attached to the pelt when the predator is presented for bounty.
7. The predator must be bountied in the district in which it was taken.
8. It is unlawful to claim bounty on a predator taken by a person other than yourself.
9. It is unlawful to hunt predators on a game reserve without the written permission from a state game protector.
10. Every person who shall give untrue or misleading information as to the time, area or county in which the predator was taken, is subject to a fine of not less than \$250 nor more than \$1,000 and a year in jail.

Instructions for the Care of Big Game: Any person hunting deer or elk should have in possession or available for his use the following equipment:

1. A good skinning knife.
2. A hand axe or hatchet.
3. Rope enough to hang up a deer or the four quarters of an elk.
4. Muslin or cheesecloth sufficient to cover a deer or the quarters of an elk.
5. Canvas sufficient to protect meat from rain or to roll deer carcass in if desired.

Care of Deer: Immediately after killing, a deer should be bled. Then it should be hung up and dressed by opening the entire length of the belly from the base of the tail to the front of the ribs. All viscera including heart and liver should be removed to speed cooling. Then it should be propped open and allowed to cool at least over one night. If flies are present it should be wrapped with muslin or cheesecloth. All moisture should be wiped out of the carcass and it should never be washed with water, or be allowed to become wet from rain.

Some hunters successfully care for meat in warm weather by hanging the deer in the open at night and taking it down when still cool in the morning and wrapping it in a large canvas and depositing it in a cool shady place during the day.

Where possible it is always best to take a deer to a local cold storage plant if it is to be held for several days.

Care of Elk: Elk is handled much the same as deer except that it should also be skinned and quartered at the time that it is dressed. The quarters will remain in best condition if they can be placed in muslin bags. They should be hung in a well ventilated place as they cool much more slowly than deer. It is very important that the meat be kept completely dry at all times.

Tagging with Big Game Seal: On male deer and elk the big game seal shall be placed and locked around the base of the branched antler. The seal so placed must be the one issued to the person killing the animal. Where female or spike deer or elk are taken the big game seal should be attached through a hole pierced in the ear.

Immediately after the close of the season the Report of Hunt card must be filled out and mailed to the Department of Game.

LICENSE REQUIREMENTS FOR JUVENILES:

Fishing: Any resident citizen under the age of 16 years may fish for game fish without a license.

Hunting: Any person, including those under the age of 16 years must have a license to hunt game birds and game animals.

Trapping: Any person, including those under the age of 16 years, must have a trapping license to take fur-bearing animals.

Duck Stamp: Any citizen under the age of 16 years may hunt migratory waterfowl without a duck stamp.

Bounty: Any resident citizen under the age of 16 years may collect bounty on certain predatory animals without a hunting and fishing license.

COOPERATION WITH FARMERS: Since small game hunting is conducted largely on privately-owned farm lands, your favorite sport depends on your being a good sportsman. When you hunt on a farm, recognize the fact that you are in reality the guest of the farmer.

Respect him accordingly, aid in protecting his property, and less land will be posted against hunting. He will be your friend if you and other hunters treat him honorably.

EVERY GOOD SPORTSMAN WILL:

1. Ask a farmer's permission to hunt on his land. Park your car where it won't interfere with him.
2. Never cut or otherwise damage fences, nor leave gates open or bars down, nor destroy posters.
3. Never shoot near buildings or livestock, nor where men are working.
4. Never overlook an act of vandalism or a violation of law by another hunter. Report such acts to the proper person, either a game protector, the farmer or person in charge of the land.
5. Cultivate the friendship of the farmer or the person in charge of the land.

HUNTERS, ATTENTION

How You Can Help Prevent Fires

SMOKING

1. **ON FOOT:** Do not smoke while traveling on foot unless it is raining, or there is snow on the ground. Occasionally stop in a safe place and enjoy your smoke.
2. **IN A CAR:** If you smoke in a car use your ash tray.
3. **MATCHES:** Be sure your match is out. Break it in two before you dispose of it.
4. **TOBACCO:** Be sure pipe ashes and cigar and cigarette stubs are dead before disposing of them. Use your foot to clear a spot of dirt the size of your hat. Put your smoking remains in the spot and rub well with dirt. Never throw burning material out of a car into brush, leaves, needles, duff or grass. Don't be a flipper.
5. **RULES:** Be sure to follow any special local smoking rules which might be in effect.

FIRES AROUND CAMP (Obtain a Campfire Permit if Required.)

1. **MAKING A CAMPFIRE:** Select a spot near water or where there is an abundance of loose clean dirt. Scrape away all inflammable material from a spot five feet in diameter. Dig a hole in the center of the spot. Keep your fire small especially in windy weather. Never build it against or near trees, logs or brush or under mossy limbs.
2. **PUTTING OUT A CAMPFIRE:** Stir the coals with a stick or shovel while soaking them with water. Turn the sticks and drench both sides. Wet the ground around the fire. Be sure the last spark is out. Feel with your hands. Never leave your campfire unattended. If you leave, put it out. Several hunter camps are burned each fall because campfires are left burning. Someone in each hunting party should be designated and responsible for extinguishing the campfire.
3. **BURNING DEBRIS:** To keep or leave a clean camp, boxes, old papers, bedding straw, and other items must be burned. If all debris cannot be burned in the campfire, select a spot in a large opening. Clean off the dry grass and duff for at least ten feet in diameter. Burn in small quantities late in the evening or early morning when the wind is not blowing. After each burning operation, put out the fire in the same manner as a campfire. Use plenty of water and stir and turn over and over the wet ashes with a shovel until the last spark is out.

WARMING FIRES IN THE WOODS

1. **WARMING:** Warming fires are discouraged. However, it is realized that when a hunter becomes cold, early in the forenoon, or after a "kill," he is apt to want to build a warming fire, particularly if it's raining or there is a light snow. But it should be realized that a warming fire must also be put out. The forest fuels are apt to dry out in the afternoon or the next day; then a fire will spread.
2. **BUILDING A WARMING FIRE:** Select a spot in a small opening. Scrape away all dry needles, leaves, grass, or rotten wood. (Use your foot or a stout stick.) Build a small fire in the middle of the spot. Keep the fire small. Never start a warming fire in a stump, a log, or a snag or tree.
3. **PUTTING OUT A WARMING FIRE:** Let the fire burn down to a few coals. If water is available put out the same as a campfire. If water is not available, thoroughly mix the coals with clean dirt free from all sticks, rotten wood, or leaves. Continue to mix and rub with dirt until all sparks are out. Feel with the hands to be sure. Do not cover with dirt—mix and rub instead.

FIRE EQUIPMENT

Each hunting party should have a minimum of fire equipment in camp. It's needed anyhow for other purposes than putting out fires. The minimum needs are:

1. **AXE:** It should be sharp—not less than 26 inches in length overall with head weighing two pounds or over. If preferred use a Pulaski; it's a more useful tool in camp.
2. **SHOVEL:** It should be not less than 36 inches long over-all with a round pointed head not less than 8 inches wide.
3. **WATER CONTAINER:** A bucket or water bag with capacity of one gallon or more.

1946 Migratory Waterfowl and Migratory Game Bird Regulations for the State of Washington

GENERAL OPEN SEASONS:

Duck, Coot, Geese and Brant (except Ross's Goose and Swan—closed season)—October 26 to December 9, 1946, both dates inclusive, in all counties in the state.
Except: It shall be unlawful to hunt, take or pursue geese in Adams, Benton, Franklin, Klickitat and Walla Walla counties at any other time than on Sundays, Mondays and Thursdays during the period October 26 to December 9, 1946, both dates inclusive.
Wilson's Snipe or Jacksnipe and Rails and Gallinules (except Coot)—Season closed.
Band-tailed pigeons—September 1 to September 30, both dates inclusive.

BAG LIMITS:

Ducks (except American and Redbreasted Mergansers):
Daily Bag Limit—Seven (7) ducks, straight or mixed bag, except such limit may not contain more than one (1) wood duck.
Possession Limit—Fourteen (14) ducks, straight or mixed bag, except such limit may not contain more than one (1) wood duck.
American and Redbreasted Mergansers:
Daily Bag Limit—Twenty-five (25) singly or mixed bag.
Geese and Brant (except Ross's Goose):
Daily Bag Limit—Two (2) geese of any kind, including Brant, and in addition two (2) Snow geese.
Possession Limit is one daily bag limit of geese.

Coot: Twenty-five (25) per day and not more than twenty-five (25) in possession at any one time.

Band-tailed Pigeons—Ten (10) per day and not more than ten (10) in possession at any one time.

Note: Only one daily bag limit of migratory game birds is allowed in possession on the first day of the season.

HUNTING HOURS: See pages 10 and 11 for schedule of lawful shooting hours.

POSSESSION TIME LIMIT:

It shall be unlawful to have in possession migratory waterfowl or birds which were taken in this state more than ninety (90) days after the close of the open season; and it shall be unlawful to have in possession migratory waterfowl or birds which were taken outside this state, more than ninety (90) days after the close of the open season in the state or country in which they were taken.

MEANS OF TAKING:

Feeding and Live Decoys Illegal: It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or take migratory waterfowl or birds by the aid or use, directly or indirectly, of corn, wheat, oats or other grain or products thereof, salt, or any kinds of feed whatsoever, placed, deposited, distributed, scattered, or otherwise put out whereby such waterfowl or birds are lured, attracted, or enticed, regardless of the distance intervening between any such grain, salt, or feed and the position of the taker; and it shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl by the use, directly or indirectly, of live duck or goose decoys, regardless of the distance intervening between any such live decoys and the position of the taker.

Illegal Devices and Boats: It shall be unlawful for any person to use any sink box, sink boat, sneak boat or any water craft not propelled by hand with side oars not less than five feet in length, and one oar to be used on each side thereof, and the person rowing therein to be in an upright position and visible at all times from the waist up while hunting migratory game birds.

Rifles and Pistols Banned: It shall be unlawful for any person to shoot at any migratory game birds with a rifle or a pistol within the State of Washington.

FEDERAL REGULATION:

All persons over sixteen years of age, hunting migratory waterfowl, are required to have in their personal possession an unexpired federal migratory bird hunting stamp, validated by their signature written across the face thereof in ink.

HUNTING CLOSURE—COLUMBIA AND SNAKE RIVER:

It shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl or migratory birds on or within one-quarter mile of the Columbia River between the Grand Coulee Dam and the railroad bridge across the Columbia River at Wishram, Klickitat county. It shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl and migratory birds on or within one-half mile of the Snake River in Franklin and Walla Walla counties and it shall be unlawful to hunt migratory waterfowl or migratory birds on or within one-quarter mile of the Snake River in Columbia, Garfield, Asotin and Whitman counties EXCEPT, that part thereof which constitutes the boundary between the states of Washington and Idaho.
